**AKC Delegate (Roberta Berman):** It was March and time for the AKC Delegate's assembly. The weather report was horrific. On Monday, the weather was sort of decent, so I went. However, on Tuesday, considering discretion the better part of valor, and having a rather healthy regard for my flesh and dread of icy, unplowed roads, I chose not to attend. To put it simply, the weather sucked big time. We had snow, sleet, rain, sleet, and again snow during the course of the day. Definitely not for the faint of heart.

Soooo....this is a partial report. Tuesday was our annual meeting, at which we elect four new members to the Board of Directors. The new members of the Board are Dominic Carotta, Rita J. Biddle and Harvey M. Wooding. This is Harvey's second term, but both Dominic and Rita are new.

This is still under discussion, but it was suggested that each parent club should see if they can make some sort of arrangement to preserve and protect those straws that are in storage and whose owner has passed on to his/her great reward or is going there shortly. I know the sperm is often sold to someone, but if that isn't the case, what can the club do to preserve and protect what could be an important asset for the breed. Oh, it was also suggested that should you be in possession of pupicles, make sure they are taken care of in your will.

Parent Club: As usual it was a long agenda, so I will not bore you with the bulk of it, only what I think is important. First on the agenda was the Parent Club Conference e-list. It has been suggested that the officers of every parent club should be on this list. Sounds like a plan.

Market Place: We were reminded that the clubs are the ultimate authority on their breed standard and history, so it behooves us to have people with the knowledge to check the site periodically to make sure that all the information is correct. Marketplace should be connected with the club's web site, and our site should be user friendly. It should have parts for club members and parts for the general population, at that part should be kept up-to-date. Also, there is an annual \$2000 grant available from the AKC. It is listed on the Marketplace web site, but I have no idea how one gets the money.

Last, yet again....group realignment. It is yet again under study and discussion. More news when there is news.

### **Manchester Terrier, BIO, Pamela DeHetre May 2017**

Manchester Terriers are one of my favorite breeds and my experience with them dates back to my childhood. To give you some history, when I was a child my aunt had Toy Manchester Terriers as pets. I was familiar with the breed early in my life although did not own one myself. In the late 1960's I was privileged to meet MariBeth O'Neill and her beautiful bitch CH Renreh Lorelei of Charmaron, HOF. (Renreh is Rod Herner who is also an AKC licensed judge of Manchester Terriers as well as many other breeds). I was immediately hooked!! However it wasn't until the mid 1970's that I was able to become involved in breeding and handling them.

I was very fortunate that my second Toy Manchester, CH Pamelot's Xanadu, HOF (also out of a Renreh bitch), who Pat Dresser helped me acquire, easily became an AKC Champion handled by myself and my daughter, Angela. We bred Xanadu to CH Charmaron's Cheddar of Toy, HOF, ROM (a Lorelei grandson) which turned out to be a great combination. In my first litter I had two dogs that were Group winners and in the second litter I produced three Group winners as well as a dog that broke the male Best in Show record at that time, CH Pamelot's Believe It Or Not, HOF, ROM who was owned by Mari-Beth. In all I have produced two different Toy All Breed Best in Show winners (the second one, CH Pamelot's Zenith of Dress Circle was co-owned by Pat Dresser and handled by DR. Chris Dresser), many Group winners and over 30 Champions (including both Standards and Toys) with limited breeding. In the 80's while others were showing my breeding I was handling a dog from Charles and Wanda Walker's great Saint Lazar Kennels, Am/Can CH St. Lazar's Monterrey Jack to Best in Show in two countries. Interestingly Jack was also sired by Cheddar. As a handler I also campaigned a Group winning Standard, CH Mejay's Eye of the Tiger, HOF.

My love of this breed began early in my life and continues to this day. Their devotion, spirit and presence captured me.

I am now an AKC Judge licensed for 20 breeds over 6 groups plus Junior Showmanship. I own Bay Creek Boarding Kennels & Grooming and Paperbacks Book Stores both located in Loganville, GA. I have one daughter, two grandsons and a great grandson.

**Rescue (Michelle Barlak):** There are two ongoing rescue situations. In late April, long time AMTC member Barbara Dillard passed away. Roger Travis, who is married to AMTC Member Marcelo Chagas, was kind enough to pick up the dogs from her son. They were turned over to Roger and Marcelo and they are taking responsibility for the dogs. Many of them have been placed directly into adoptive homes that Roger screened. Some of them have been placed into foster homes who have reached out to me. We will be providing AMTC rescue support for foster care and adoption as it is requested. Thanks go out to Roger especially for taking this on!

In a separate situation, in the first weekend in May, 4 senior Toy Manchesters were surrendered to a high kill shelter in Plano, Texas when their owner was admitted to a nursing home. Robin Gates and Dina Sellers are coordinating efforts to pull the dogs and place them in foster homes. AMTC Rescue will

provide support as needed and is ready to assist the foster homes in vet care and adoption services.  
Thank you Robin and Dina!

Madonna Lee rescued a senior Toy Manchester in Florida from a hoarding case (there were many dogs but only 1 Manchester). With assistance from AMTC Rescue, the shelter handling the seized dogs agreed to turn the Toy Manchester over to Madonna who will oversee the dog's vet care, supported with a grant from AMTC Rescue. Thank you, Madonna!

I would like to thank the AMTC Board and officers for being so supportive in all of these situations. All of these rescue cases are unique and have required flexibility.

We have received rescue donations through all of this but I would like to thank two generous donors in particular: Richard Sager recently made a \$1,500 donation to support rescue and Denise Lyman made a \$500 donation. I'm confident that these donations will go a long way in assisting AMTC Rescue in providing care for these dogs.

### **Linda Hazen Lewin Biography for Sweepstakes Judge AMTC 2017 National**

I have bred and shown dogs since the early 1970s, beginning in the show world with Dalmatians. The Charlin breeding program produced 16 champion Dalmatians over the years, all of them handled by their owners to their titles and beyond.

I acquired my first Manchester Terrier (Ch. Nova MyOnyx Likely Story) in 1996. He finished his championship very quickly and, as with my Dalmatians, he was always owner-handled. I then acquired a champion bitch (Ch. Walton's Connoquenessing, CGC, ROM, HOF) who I specialied selectively and who was awarded several Group placements under top Terrier judges. Since that time, Charlin-bred Manchester Terriers have acquitted themselves well in the show ring and as breeding dogs. Several have finished their titles from the Puppy classes, have multiple-major win records, have Best of Variety wins over ranked specials, have Group placements, and/or have themselves produced champions.

Aside from my breeding and exhibiting experience, I hold credentials in many other areas of the dog show world. I was AKC-approved to judge Dalmatians and Junior Showmanship in 1991, and to judge Poodles in 1999. I judged the Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes at the AMTC National Specialty Show in 2002 and have judged the Sweepstakes for the District 3 specialty on two occasions as well. I served as the Show Chairman for the AMTC National Specialty Show in 2008 – the National which continues to hold the all-time record for entries with 99 Toys and 51 Standards entered. I served on the AMTC Board and was on the committee which effected a complete overhaul of the AMTC Standing Rules and By-Laws, helping to improve processes and systems for all functions of the club. I am an AMTC-approved mentor/instructor for Manchester Terriers and have ringside-mentored many aspiring Manchester judges in that capacity.

I would be honored to be chosen to judge the 2017 AMTC Sweepstakes. Thank you for your consideration!

**AMTC 2017 NATIONAL SPECIALTY UPDATE – Carolyn Horowitz:** The 2017 National Specialty will be held on December 15, 2017, in Orlando, Florida, in conjunction with the AKC/Royal Canin


