REPORTS FROM THE SECRETARY

American Manchester Terrier Club
March 28, 2018 Board Meeting Minutes

The AMTC Board of Directors met via telephone conference call on March 28th, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 7:44 p.m. by Christina Caridis Jordan, 1st V.P. in the absence of Pres. Jeremy McClister (who attended soon after meeting called to order and presided over the meeting).

In attendance: Pres. Jeremy McClister (late), Christina Caridis Jordan, Roberta Berman, Kathy Nissen, Sherrie Brock, Bev Leidner, Ellen Murtagh, Susan Thrasher. Absent: Dianna Texter (vacation).

Minutes of the 2018 February meeting were previously sent to the board via email for review. Motion to approve the AMTC February 2018 Board Meeting Minutes as drafted made by Bev Leidner, 2nd by Sherrie Brock. All approved. Motion to approve February 2018 Board minutes carried.

President's Report: President, Jeremy McClister provided an update on the 2018 AMTC National event and noted a website link will be sent out via email/e-lists/etc. for purchasing T-shirts/hoodies.


I am interested in joining the American Manchester Terrier Club. I first became aware of the breed in the 1980's when I returned home from a trip to find my husband had rescued a 9-year-old dog from the animal shelter. She had one bad leg that needed attention, and when we took her to our vet, he told us she was a Toy Manchester. After reconstructive surgery, she quickly regained complete use of the leg. She blessed us with 9 more years as a major part of our family. After she passed away, I researched the breed and purchased a 6-month old Manchester. I was able to take an early retirement at this time (1995) and found an obedience training club. I was hooked on the training and competing right away. We competed in obedience and rally in AKC, UKC and CKC. She was the first dog I had ever trained. I also was given a Min Pin when Annie was 2, and I did show her in conformation and completed her CH in Canada as well as UKC. The two dogs competed together in brace.

I obtained my current Manchester on April 28, 2016 from Judy Fleischaker. I eased him into my obedience training and then took an agility class with him. (I had never done agility before.) 2017 was our first full year together, and we earned the following titles in AKC: RA ACT1 CGC TKI NAJP. He also became a Therapy Dog through TDI. In UKC he has earned his SPOT, URO3, and this year has earned his nose work Novice Container title.

I am a member of three training clubs; Obedience Training Club of Greater Lansing (since 1995), Tri-County Canine Sports (a board member), and Capital City Canine Club. I have served as a board member, vice president and president and am currently an instructor at OTCGL teaching Rally.

I love this breed and love to tell everyone I meet about the history of the Manchester. So many people have never seen them and I am eager to educate. I would love to meet other owners and be able to compete at shows where my little guy will see other dogs like him. He is truly the joy of my life.

having my second Manchester Terrier to love, go for morning and evening walks with, snuggle with, discuss everything with, and share time with.




Disaster Preparedness Packet

This Plan is intended to help you keep your pets safe in natural disasters and everyday emergencies. The best way to keep your pets safe during an emergency is to keep them with you. However, with our busy lives we all know this is not always possible.

So, start getting ready now.

ID YOUR PET

Make sure that your cats and dogs are wearing collars and identification tags. You'll increase your chances of being reunited with pets who get lost by having them microchipped: make sure the microchip registration is in your name. But remember: The average citizen who finds your pet won't be able to scan for a chip, but they will be able to read a basic tag!

Put your cell phone number on your pet's ID tag. It may also be a good idea to include the phone number of a friend or relative outside your immediate area—in case you have had to evacuate.

Put together your Disaster Kit: See checklist to assemble an **emergency kit** for yourself and your pet(s).

Find a safe place to stay ahead of time: Never assume that you will be allowed to bring your pet to an emergency shelter. **Before a disaster hits, call your local office of emergency management** to see if you will be allowed to evacuate with your pets and verify that there will be shelters in your area that take people and their pets.

Contact hotels and motels outside your immediate area to find out if they accept pets. Ask about any restrictions on number, size and species. Inquire if a "no pet" policy would be waived in an emergency. Keep a list of animal friendly places handy, and call ahead for a reservation as soon as you think you might have to leave your home.

Make arrangements with friends or relatives. Ask people outside your immediate area if they would be able to shelter you and your pets—or just your pets—if necessary. If you have more than one pet, you may need to arrange to house them at separate locations.

Consider a kennel or veterinarian's office. Make a list of boarding facilities and veterinary offices that might be able to shelter animals in disaster emergencies (make sure to include their 24-hour telephone numbers).

Check with your local animal shelter. Some shelters may be able to provide foster care or shelter your pets in an emergency. But keep in mind that shelters have limited resources and are likely to be stretched during a local emergency.

Make sure your dog is up to date on vaccines. Many places that would take animals during an emergency will not take them without **up to date proof of vaccines**.

If you have a pet sitter, they may be able to help. Discuss the possibility well in advance.

Plan for your pet in case you're not home

In case you're away during a disaster or evacuation order, make arrangements well in advance for someone you trust to take your pets and meet you at a specified location. Be sure the person is comfortable with your pets and your pets are familiar with them. Give your emergency caretaker a key to your home and show them where your pets are likely to be (especially if they hide when they are nervous) and where your disaster supplies are kept.

If you evacuate, take your pet.

Rule Number One: If it isn't safe for you, it isn't safe for your pets. You have no way of knowing how long you'll be kept out of the

area, and you may not be able—or allowed—to go back for your pets. Pets left behind in a disaster can easily be injured, lost or killed.

PLEDGE TO TAKE YOUR PETS WITH YOU WHEN DISASTER STRIKES!!

Rule Number Two: Evacuate Early. Don't wait for a mandatory evacuation order. Some people who have waited to be evacuated by emergency officials have been told to leave their pets behind. The smell of smoke or the sound of high winds or thunder may make your pet more fearful and difficult to load into a crate or carrier. Evacuating before conditions become severe will keep everyone safer and make the process less stressful.

Rule Number Three: If you stay home, do it safely. If your family and pets must wait out a storm or other disaster at home identify a safe area of your home where you can all stay together.

*Close off and eliminate unsafe nooks and crannies where frightened animals may try to hide.

*Move dangerous items such as tools or toxic products that have been stored in the area.

*Bring your pets indoors as soon as local authorities say trouble is on the way. Keep dogs on leashes and cats in carriers, and make sure they are wearing identification.

*If you have a room that you can designate as a "safe room", put your emergency supplies in that room in advance, including your pets crate and supplies. Have any medications and a supply of pet food and water inside watertight containers, along with your other emergency supplies.

*Listen to the radio periodically and don't come out until you know it is safe.

*Don't allow your pets to roam loose. Familiar landmarks and smells might be gone, and your pet will probably be disoriented. Pets can easily get lost in such situations.

*While you assess the damage, keep dogs on leashes and cats in carriers inside the house. If your house is damaged, pets could escape.

*Be patient with your pets after a disaster. Try to get them back into their normal routines as soon as possible. Be ready for behavioral problems caused by the stress of the situation. If these problems persist, or if your pet seems to be having any health problems, talk to your veterinarian.

*If your community has been flooded, check your home and yard for wild animals who may have sought refuge there. Wildlife can pose a threat to you and your pets.

*If you can't get home to your pets make sure you have a trusted neighbor, friend or family member and give them a key. Make sure this backup caretaker is comfortable and familiar with your pets (and vice versa).

*Make sure your backup caretaker knows your pets' feeding and medication schedule, and where to find a copy of your emergency plan.

*Heat Wave or electricity goes out: high temperatures can be dangerous. If your electricity goes out take your pets to a pet friendly hotel. If it is summer, just an hour or two in the sweltering heat can be dangerous.

With so many recent disasters, many agencies have stepped up to the plate and updated their websites with information regarding natural and not-so-natural disasters. Many have good information and some had ideas I had not thought of before.

Because so many have good information, I've just included links at the end, and I'll just highlight some of the information.

Making A Plan:

Plan now to find temporary homes for your pets. Those of use with more than 2 dogs may not have someone immediately willing to take on all of our crew. If they need to be separated, being able to at least buddy them up will help.

Keep carriers where you can easily get to them. Having crates up in the attic, in the basement, etc. will not help in flood or fire. I keep enough crates to crate all of my dogs in my toy hauler when it is on my property. Buy collapsible crates and attaching zip ties to secure the sides. If they are plastic, write your name, address & phone in black sharpie. If wire, attach a sheet in plastic with info.

Check with your city and county animal control regarding their disaster preparedness plans. Washoe County had a presentation on Fire, Earthquakes, Floods & Weather last September for anyone to attend. They also are there to help in a disaster or emergency. Since I am in a fire area, our animal services has a network of areas that people can take their cattle, horses, dog and cats during a fire.

MAKE SURE YOUR DOG IS UP TO DATE ON VACCINES – many places that would take animals during an emergency will not take them without proof of up-to-date vaccines.

Preparing a Pet disaster kit:

There are several great lists out there but one thing most did not state – food for your animal should be vacuumed sealed, or canned with a can opener. Having a baggie of dog food does no good if you do not have an emergency for a few years. Amazon has several reasonably priced kits and one is the ER Emergency Ready Deluxe Survival kit – 2 dogs kit for about \$75.00. The food is approved for up to 5 years and US Coast Guard Approved.

Add plastic bags, single use sanitizer & paper towels placed in plastic bags to clean up if needed.

Add Bottled water for at least a week – 1 gal/med dog per day.

Another item to add to your kit is additional collars, leashes & tags for each of your dogs that include your cell #, and address. If you must leave them with someone else, you will immediately have a collar and identification without having to look for enough collars.

Keep a 2 months supply of heartworm/flea/tick medications in your emergency kit. Rotate out with new to keep from expiring

Pictures of each animal , microchip #'s, proof of vaccines and rabies , copies of any needed vet information, names, addresses & phone # of your current vet, name, address & phone of those able to help you in an emergency.

Have the phone #'s of agencies to call entered in your contacts list in case of an emergency in your area., as well as in your emergency kit.

If you live in an area with a fair amount of water, consider vaccinating for leptospirosis.

RedRover shelters and cares for animals displaced by natural disasters and other crises in the United States and Canada. If you need sheltering assistance, you can call RedRover at (800) 440-3277 or visit RedRover.org Add this number to your contacts list in your phone.

Add Pet Friendly hotels to your contacts or to your kit.

Additional Information

Consider adding a “Lost Dog” app to your phone. I googled quite a few & pasted a link to just one below. Even the ASCPA has one - not going there!

The 9th International Conference on Canine and Feline Genetics and Genomics, St. Paul, MN, May 2017 (submitted by JoAnn Emrick)

A Potassium Channel Mutation is Associated with Sudden Cardiac Death in Juvenile Toy Manchester Terriers

Juvenile dilated cardiomyopathy (JDCM) in Toy Manchester Terriers results in sudden cardiac death in the first year of life. Death is presumed to be due to a fatal arrhythmia. The objective of this study was to perform a genome-wide association study to identify the causal mutation underlying JDCM in Toy Manchester Terriers. Cases comprised 12 dogs confirmed to have JDCM by postmortem histopathology. Male cases were additionally cryptorchid. Controls comprised 36 dogs >2 years of age and unrelated within two generations. Genotyping was performed via the Illumina Canine HD BeadChip, and quality control was performed with PLINK. A mixed model analysis was performed using GenABEL and revealed a chromosome 27 locus strongly associated with JDCM ($P_{raw} = 5.6 \times 10^{-7}$, $P_{genome} = 0.01$, $\lambda = 1.06$). The critical region encompasses two cardiac potassium channel genes associated with cardiomyopathies in humans. Exonic sequencing identified a nonsynonymous substitution in the ABC transmembrane domain of one of the genes; this variant was predicted to be highly deleterious by multiple variant effect prediction tools. All 12 original cases plus 6 additional JDCM cases were homozygous for this mutation. Two cryptorchid male puppies were also found to be homozygous for the mutation; one was euthanized and confirmed to have JDCM on histopathology, and the other is still alive at six months of age. Allele frequency in 340 Toy Manchester Terriers with no history of JDCM was 0.12. In conclusion, JDCM in Toy Manchester Terriers is caused by an autosomal recessive missense mutation in a cardiac potassium channel gene.

American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL

I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING

I pledge:

1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC.
2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of studs or bitches with no regard to quality.
3. To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program.
4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes.
5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING

I pledge:

1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale.
2. To provide all buyers with:
 - A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller.
 - B. Minimum three-generation pedigree.
 - C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc.
 - D. Provide instructions for feeding and care.
 - E. Be available for guidance and questions.
3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes.
4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING

I pledge:

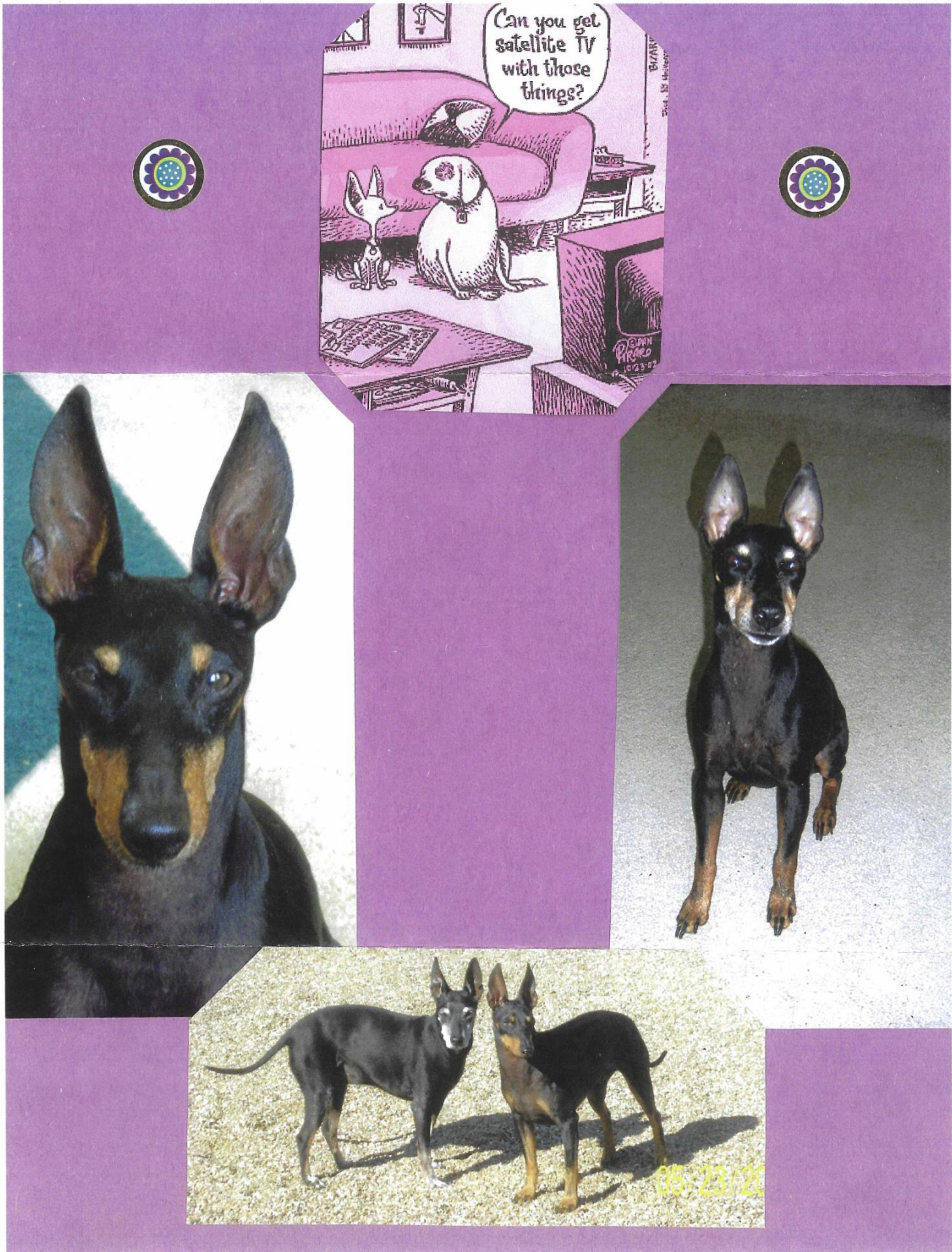
1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability.
2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition.
3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES

I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.
