

For health updates: I wanted to let everyone know that GenSol Diagnostics is now recognized by OFA. They only charge \$40 for vWd testing. Their web site is GenSolDX.com.

AMTC Rescue Report

Michelle Barlak, East Coast Rescue Chair

The AMTC Rescue program converted to a grant-making program in 2014. What this means is that we stopped officially accepting dogs into our program for fostering and instead, issued grants to pay the vet bills of dogs that are fostered by other rescue organizations and individuals who took in Manchester Terriers. AMTC Rescue paid the vet bills for these dogs and assisted with finding them suitable homes. This program has worked very well and we plan to continue it.

However, this summer I was contacted about a group of 10 Manchester Terriers in need of vet care, fostering/rehab and placement. It became clear that these dogs would need to be cared for by experienced Manchester Terrier people and finding another group to take on these dogs was not an option in my mind. My appeal to the Board to temporarily reinstate the AMTC Rescue foster program for this group of dogs was approved quickly and I was able to have more resources to evaluate the dogs, arrange for veterinary care, and seek out volunteers to assist with transport and fostering. We successfully took the dogs into our program on August 10, 2018 and as I write this, nearly all of the dogs have adopters waiting for them once their medical care has been completed.

So many people volunteered to help with the initial evaluation, transport, and foster care! All of the dogs were able to be placed in foster homes with experienced Manchester terrier people and I'm pleased to say that the majority of our adopters also have experience with the breed, which is important when you consider that these rescues are coming to us with baggage. They are wonderful, sweet natured dogs and will be alright once they settle into their new homes, I am sure.

New Study with University of Minnesota

The AMTC and CMTC health committees are launching a new project that we hope will lead to a genetic markers for protein-losing disease in our breed. Protein-Losing Enteropathy (PLE) and Protein-Losing Nephropathy (PLN) are umbrella terms that refer to conditions of the gastrointestinal tract and

kidney that result in a loss of protein from the body. This family of immune-related diseases includes, among others, Intestinal Lymphangiectasia, IBD, Familial Glomerulopathy, Amyloidosis, and some forms of Glomerulonephritis. While treatment is available to help manage symptoms, the diseases cannot be cured and they are quite devastating for the dogs and their owners to deal with, sometimes resulting in death. We are currently seeking blood or tissue from Manchester Terriers (living or deceased) who have been diagnosed with PLE/PLN. By action of the Board of Directors, the Manchester Terrier and Toy Manchester Terrier will become identified as one breed, known as the Manchester Terrier, effective January 1, 1959. The breed will have two varieties in show classifications: Standard Variety, over 12 pounds and not exceeding 22 pounds; Toy Variety, not exceeding 12 pounds.

In furtherance of this action, the Board has adopted a resolution making all persons presently eligible to judge Toy Manchester Terriers eligible to be approved to judge both varieties of the breed at shows held on and after January 1, 1959.

The Board has also approved a standard for the Manchester Terrier, which will become effective January 1, 1959 and which is published elsewhere on the Secretary's page in this issue.

The Board has ratified an action taken by the American Toy Manchester Terrier Club to change its name to "American Manchester Terrier Club," which will hereafter be known as the parent club of the Manchester Terrier breed.

Belgian Sheepdogs

As announced in the October 1958 GAZETTE, the Board of Directors has given

further study to the changes in registration policy and show classification for Belgian Sheepdogs, and has adopted the following changes, some of which are the same as those published in the September 1958 GAZETTE.

Effective immediately, only Groenendael dogs will be eligible for registration as Belgian Sheepdogs. Tervueren and Malinois dogs will be registered as "Belgian Tervueren" and "Belgian Malinois" respectively. New registration certificates will be issued to the owners of Tervueren and Malinois which are now registered as Belgian Sheepdogs.

Groenendael dogs of mixed Groenendael, Tervueren or Malinois parentage, or which are the offspring of registered dogs of such mixed parentage, provided they were produced by matings which occurred before notice of the contemplated change was given, will be registered if the owners wish it; but the registration certificate will bear the notation that no offspring of such dogs will be registered. The same applies to dogs of this type that are already registered. The owners have been notified that future offspring of their dogs will not be eligible for registration. However, such registered dogs may be entered and shown for life in dog shows and obedience trials held under American Kennel Club rules.

Tervueren dogs of registered litters that are of mixed Groenendael-Tervueren parentage will be registered as "Belgian Tervueren" without restrictions, provided the litters resulted from matings which occurred before notice of the contemplated change was given.

Effective July 1, 1959 only Groenendael dogs may be shown as Belgian Sheepdogs. Separate show classification will be provided for Belgian Tervueren. Belgian Malinois may be shown in the Miscellaneous Class. No provisions will be made for the registration or showing of any other type. Groenendael, Tervueren and Malinois may continue to be entered and shown as Belgian Sheepdogs at dog shows held on or before June 30, 1959.

An imported Groenendael with an otherwise acceptable pedigree will be eligible for registration as a Belgian Sheepdog only if its ancestry is entirely Groenendael for at least three generations. An imported Tervueren with an otherwise acceptable three generation pedigree will be eligible for registration as a Belgian Tervueren even though some of its ancestors in the three generations may be Malinois or Groenendael.

Notice
Amendment to the Beagle Field Trial Procedures

The Board of Directors has adopted the following amendment to Procedure 1C to be effective immediately:

Delete the third sentence and substitute the following:

"At a trial run in Large Packs no person shall act as Marshal for a class in which he has a hound entered; and at a trial run in Small Packs no person shall act as Roving Marshal for a class in which he has a hound entered."

So that Procedure 1G in full will read: "The Field Trial Committee shall appoint a Marshal or Marshals to carry out the orders of the Judges. Marshals may advise Judges but must carry out the instructions of the Judges whose decision is final. At a trial run in Large Packs no person shall act as Marshal for a class in which he has a hound entered; and at a trial run in Small Packs no person shall act as Roving Marshal for a class in which he has a hound entered. Marshals shall be identified by badges carrying the designation 'Marshal'."

Standard for Manchester Terriers

The Board of Directors has examined and approved the following standard for Manchester Terriers, to be effective January 1, 1959:

HEAD:
Long, narrow, tight skinned, almost flat, with a slight indentation up the forehead; slightly wedge shaped, tapering to the nose, with no visible cheek muscles, and well filled up under the eyes; level in mouth, with tight lipped jaws.

EYES:
Small, bright, sparkling and as near black as possible; set moderately close together; oblong in shape, slanting upwards on the outside; they should neither protrude nor sink in the skull.

NOSE:
Black.

EARS (Toy Variety):
Of moderate size; set well up on the skull and rather close together; thin, moderately narrow at base; with pointed tips; naturally erect carriage. Wide, flaring, blunt tipped or "bell" ears are a serious fault; cropped or cut ears shall disqualify.

EARS (Standard Variety):
Erect, or button, small and thin; smaller at the root and set as close together as possible at the top of the head. If cropped, to a point, long and carried erect.

NECK and SHOULDERS:
The neck should be a moderate length, slim and graceful; gradually becoming larger as it approaches, and blend smoothly with the sloping shoulders; free from throatiness; slightly arched from the occiput.

CHEST:
Narrow between the legs; deep in the brisket.

BODY:
Moderately short, with robust loins; ribs well sprung out behind the shoulders; back slightly arched at the loin, and falling again to the tail to the same height as the shoulder.

LEGS:
Forelegs straight, of proportionate length, and well under body. Hindlegs should not turn in or out as viewed from the rear; carried back; hocks well let down.

FEET:
Compact, well arched, with jet black nails, the two middle toes in the front feet rather longer than the others; the hind feet shaped like those of a cat.

TAIL:
Moderately short, and set on where the arch of the back ends; thick where it joins the body, tapering to a point, not carried higher than the back.

COAT:
Smooth, short, thick, dense, close and glossy; not soft.

COLOR:
Jet black and rich mahogany tan, which should not run or blend into each other but abruptly forming clear, well-defined lines of color division. A small tan spot over each eye; a very small tan spot on each cheek; the lips of the upper and lower jaws should be tanned, extending under the throat, ending in the shape of the letter V; the inside of the ears partly tanned. Tan spots, called rosettes, on each side of the chest above the front legs, more pronounced in puppies than in adults. There should be a black "thumb mark" patch on the front of each foreleg between the pastern and the knee. There should be a distinct black "pencil mark" line running length-wise on the top of each toe on all four feet. The remainder of the forelegs to be tan to the knee. Tan on the hind legs should continue from the peniculating on the feet up the inside of the legs to a little below the stifle joint; the outside of the hind legs to be black. There should be tan under the tail, and on the vent, but only of such size as to be covered by the tail. White in any part of the coat is a serious fault, and shall disqualify whenever the white shall form a patch or stripe measuring as much as one-half inch in its longest dimension.

WEIGHT (Toy Variety):
Not exceeding 12 pounds. It is suggested that clubs consider dividing the American-bred and Open Classes by weight as follows: 7 pounds and under, over 7 pounds and not exceeding 12 pounds.

WEIGHT (Standard Variety):
Over 12 pounds and not exceeding 22 pounds. Dogs weighing over 22 pounds shall be disqualified. It is suggested that clubs consider dividing the American-bred and Open Classes by weight as follows: over 12 pounds and not exceeding 16 pounds, over 16 pounds and not exceeding 22 pounds.

Applications For Judge's Licenses

The following applicants who are presently being licensed for one or more breed or obedience trial classes are now applying for an additional breed or breeds or class Communications in regard to their qualifications must reach the offices of the American Kennel Club on or before January 1, 1959, otherwise they cannot be considered by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club in their approval or disapproval of the licenses.

These decisions were well thought out and researched by the committee and are our recommendations by majority. In this particular section, "Breed Standard Revision Procedures," we have from A - G, seven steps to follow closely.

Then, there were 12 lengthy points we had to consider in writing the Breed Standard

Next, follow the Standard format, I through X.

It's quite a time consuming process. We are almost there! ♥

AKC Delegates Report

Delegate's Report September 2018

This meeting was the one at which the delegates elect members for the various committees we have. Basically, if you were on a committee, you are still on it. The old guard won.

The assembly itself was primarily concerned with a whole mess of rules that required clarification or simple changes. Pretty much this was a laundry list to be presented to the assembly in December. There were three amendments presented for votes at this meeting. They were the following changes:

1. At a show with a limited entry the number of dogs or total entry must be indicated on the premium list.
2. At an All-Breed show Reserve Best In Show shall be rewarded before the Best In Show is announced.
3. At all-breed shows, prizes offered on a three-time basis may now include Reserve Best In Show as well as Best in Show or Group, provided the prize is won by the same owner and/or breeder not necessarily with the same dog.

They were approved.

AKC Delegates Report, Cont.

As for the laundry list, the most interesting one, which directly affects breeds like ours is one that will allow 1 point to be granted to the Best of Winners at shows in which there is only one dog and one bitch entered with no Specials.

Another interesting amendment to be discussed and voted upon has to do with dogs disqualified for bad behavior. At the time of the disqualification a permanent identification of the dog must be made should the owner/handler want to have to dog reinstated. Permanent identification can be a photo taken at the time of the infraction, a record of the dog's microchip number or tattoo or some distinguishing feature of the dog that is unalterable.

There is more to this proposed amendment, but it would take too long for me to tell you about them now. Let us see if the amendment passes. It has been under discussion for quite a while and was sent back to committee once before. The second part of this amendment deals with the method used to have to dog reinstated. I'll let you know when they figure it out.

The laundry list is too long to enumerate here. Most of it is concerned with minor changes, some are more concerned with superintendents and who may act in that capacity.



When these changes occur will be time enough.

Gary Anderson (Oasis SMT) Feb. 7, 1943 to Sept. 5, 2018



Gary Anderson became involved in the sport of dogs in 1970 as an owner/handler of Dobermans. He later became a licensed AKC Pro Handler & finished many breeds. He acquired his first Manchester in 1987, Ch. Cardels Spring Shadow who was our foundation & the start of Oasis.

Of Gary's many accomplishments he was most proud of being asked to judge the 1987 DPCA TopTwenty winning BOV twice at the AMTC National and being selected to judge the 2015 AMTC National Sweepstakes, which he could not judge because of illness and the standing ovation he received ringside at the last National he attended in Vallejo, California.

Gary is greatly missed by Judy, his wife of 52 years, his 2 children, John & Debbie, his SMT Jack and all his many friends.

NEWS AND NOTES, Cont.

Christopher Gangler died May 20, 2018 after a battle with esophageal cancer. He was 55. He loved his dogs, Manchester terriers, and was known as the Cookie Man because it became his habit to fill his pockets with Milkbones when visiting Jeannine Coats and her dogs.

Chris was a natural dog handler but preferred to stay on the sidelines at dog shows, spoil the dogs at home and act as chief puppy raiser. He watched 'Best in Show', went to one dog show and decided to show his dog, Raven. He went on to handle her to a five-point major under Peter Green. Chris had no clue what that even was; he was totally oblivious.

Born in Chicago, Chris grew up in Illinois. His parents owned fishing lodges on an island in Northern Canada and it was at one of the lodges one summer where he met native Canadian Marla, his wife of 27 years, who was working there as a cook.



For the most part, Chris was a behind-the-scenes guy, which he preferred. He was a photographer, a web designer and social media guy, and he ran local political campaigns. Chris, as owner of Christopher Gangler & Associates, worked as a contract vendor for the Citrus County School District, among other business endeavors. In his time as a contracted photographer for the school district, he averaged seven events a day, a million photos a year, capturing memories and moments at 60-plus graduations, 50-plus ceremonies, about 300 school board meetings, 13 science fairs, 13 math field days and thousands and thousands of school events.

Nothing kept Chris from shooting photos at a school event — or at least kept him from trying. He made it to a school staff-vs.-student volleyball game right after undergoing eye surgery for a detached retina and another event after oral surgery.

Chris loved the Citrus County School District, its staff and its students. He loved the Beatles — and Richard Nixon. He invited Richard Nixon to his wedding. Nixon sent him his picture and an apology for not being able to attend personally. He was in mourning when Nixon died — his friends called to see if he was OK.

Chris had a quirky sense of humor and notoriously loved bad jokes and posting them on Facebook. He was a Cubs fan, enjoyed cooking but liked eating cold raviolis out of a can and omelets from IHOP. When he was diagnosed with cancer, he didn't let it stop him. As long as he could walk and hold a camera, he did. Chris is survived by Marla, his parents and brother.

Here is the deal. vWD1 has long been accepted to be a recessive component disease among breeder communities. Obviously there is now research to the contrary.

It appears on a search of the literature there has been much of evidence over the years that it is a dominant disease. However it has incomplete penetrance meaning those who have one copy will not necessarily express disease.

UC Davis, being the very principled research university they are, is emailing everyone who has tested with them so they are aware of the change. Absolutely has nothing to do with their rights to test or validity of the results. It has to do with the interpretation.

Hello,

Over the next several days, you will be receiving an updated Von Willebrand Disease report. We incorrectly treated vWD Type 1 as a recessive trait and indicated that dogs with 1 copy of the mutation were carriers and unaffected. This disorder is in fact considered to be dominant with incomplete penetrance. This means that dogs with one or two copies of this mutation may be affected or may be susceptible to have this bleeding disorder. Furthermore, not all dogs that have the mutation will develop vWD Type 1 disease.

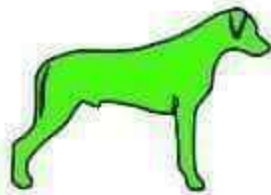

American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL

I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING

I pledge:

1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC.
2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of studs or bitches with no regard to quality.
3. To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program.
4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes.
5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING

I pledge:

1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale.
2. To provide all buyers with:
 - A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller.
 - B. Minimum three-generation pedigree.
 - C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc.
 - D. Provide instructions for feeding and care.
 - E. Be available for guidance and questions.
3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes.
4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING

I pledge:

1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability.
2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition.
3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES

I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.
