Proposed Updates to AMTC Standing Rules and/or Guidelines for Future Membership Approval

July 24th, 2019 - Nothing to report at this time.

June 26th, 2019 – Proposed removal of "Membership Committee" from Standing Rules Proposed reinstatement of the "Ethics Committee" utilizing previous language. Proposed "Provisional Status" for AMTC Mentoring Requirements

May 22nd, 2019 - Proposed revisions to HOF Point System - Revising Requirements to Earn Points

May 1st, 2019 – Board reviewed and voted to reapprove all proposed changes that expired from Jan.2017 and Oct. of 2017 as noted below.

March 27th, 2019 – No proposed revisions to SR/Guidelines by the AMTC Board.

February 27th, 2019 – No proposed revisions to SR/Guidelines by the AMTC Board.

January 23rd, 2019 – Proposed Change to SR – Article 1.1 "A directory of the Club members shall be supplied to the membership by April 1st of each year in accordance with the GENERAL CONDUCT of BUSINESS GUIDLELINES, POLICIES and PROCEDURES" 1.0 (1.1).. which notes the distribution deadline of the directory as May 1st of each year. While the SR supersede the Guidelines, the board would like to amend the date noted in both sections to April 15th of each year in order to allow sufficient time to finalize paid memberships following the March 1st grace period, edit any listings, proof, print and mail.

Proposed Changes to Guidelines, Policies and Procedures:

Dec. 26th, 2018 – Agility trial profits changed to "75% of the profited funds shall go to the club's General Fund with 25% of these funds to hosting district".

September 26th, 2018 – Select Dog/Bitch shall receive a trophy/award when presented at an AMTC National or District Specialty Events.

September 26th, 2018 – Select Dog/Bitch shall receive the same number of HOF points as an Award of Merit when presented at an AMTC National event.

May 23rd, 2018 – Hall of Fame Points addition: include points for Scent Work in calculating HOF points with 25 points awarded. This was tabled until the July 2019 Board Meeting.

October 25th, 2017 – The top 5 Stud dogs/Brood bitches of both varieties shall be recognized annually with an award certificate.

October 25th, 2017 – The top Junior handler each year shall receive a plaque for Top Junior Handler in recognition of their accomplishment. All junior handlers shall receive a plaque or certificate of recognition for their accomplishments each year.

January 25th – Newsletter subscription – The AMTC newsletter will be published online on the club's website. A \$15/year subscription fee for a postal mailed copy of the club's quarterly newsletter shall be required.

May 1st (April) 2019 AMTC Board Meeting Minutes

The April 2019 AMTC Board meeting was postponed until May 1st due to scheduling conflicts with several board members. There will be another board meeting held May 22nd, 2019.

The teleconference board meeting was brought to order by President, Susan Thrasher at 7:34 p.m. CDT.

Roll Call: Present: Pres.: - Susan Thrasher, 1^{st} V.P. - Christina Caridis, 2^{nd} V.P. - Roberta Berman, Secretary - Kathy Nissen, Treasurer - Dianna Texter. Board members: Jean Good, Beverly Leidner, Ellen Murtagh and Patrick Mackesey.

Officers' Reports:

President, Susan Thrasher requested a motion to approve the March 2019 AMTC Board meeting minutes that were provided to the board via email for review. Motion to approve made by Roberta Berman, 2nd by Dianna Texter. All in favor – motion carried.

1st V.P. Christina Caridis, noted proposed revisions to our SR/Guidelines from 2017 were not ratified by the membership at the AMTC Annual meeting and the board would need to reapprove these proposed revisions in order to present them for approval at the 2019 Annual meeting. Motion to reinstate these proposed revisions made by Beverly Leidner, 2nd by Dianna Texter. All in favor – motion carried.

Secretary, Kathy Nissen, informed the board we have one new membership application which will be published in the May 2019 issue of the newsletter and on our club's website in the "members only" section.

Treasurer's Report: Dianna provided the financial report. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report made by Roberta Berman. 2nd by Patrick Mackesey. All in favor. Motion carried. The financial report can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.

Committee Reports:

2019 AMTC National Show Chair, Christina Caridis reported the event is on track and a 'national packet' will be out shortly. It is hoped club members will be able to order national related items directly from the vendor providing these items.

Board member, Jean Good, asked about the progress of the proposed formation of all performance and companion events being combined in to one committee. Obedience chairperson, Roberta Berman and Jean Good will work together on this matter. Karen Langlois has agreed to chair Agility.

Old Business:

1st V.P., Christina Caridis, noted the list of items in the club archives may need further updating. Roberta Berman will contact Archives Chairperson, Virginia Antia regarding this matter.

Possible revision of our Guidelines pertaining to the percentages of disbursement of funds generated from the Annual auction was discussed. There have been members requesting monies generated from their donated item go to a specific area such as health, rescue, etc. The board agreed no revision is necessary and this Guideline shall be enforced.

Secretary, Kathy Nissen, informed the board the proposed committee guidelines for MTOY, Juniors and Rescue were submitted to each appropriate chairperson for their review.

New Business:

Trophies for Montgomery and Progressive shows were discussed. The board agreed to offer Best of Breed at each show with a limit of \$100/per trophy. Motion to approve made by Dianna Texter, 2nd by Kathy Nissen. All in favor – motion carried.

The board discussed the possibility of holding an Independent Specialty in Orlando in December 2019 during the AKC/Royal Canin events. Robin Gates and Marla Gangler are willing to chair and organize this event. A motion to approve holding this event made by Christina Caridis, 2nd by Patrick Mackesey. All in favor – motion carried.

Website updates/submissions/revisions: our Guidelines state the Secretary shall be the administrative person for the website with the webmaster being the technical person for updating/maintaining our website. Kathy will provide information once a month or as deemed necessary for board review prior to submission to the webmaster.

Due to extenuating circumstances, three members' dues lapsed for 2019. Upon their request to remain members, the board felt it appropriate to waive the late payment fee. Motion to approve waiving the late fee for these lapsed memberships made by Beverly Leidner, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor – motion carried.

Christina brought up review and possible revisions to the breed brochure provided by the AKC upon registration of a Manchester terrier. Susan Thrasher felt the photos should be updated. Christina will send board members the brochure via email for review and discussion at a later date.

Dianna Texter presented a request by Michelle Barlak, Health Chairperson, for permission to offer a grant of \$250 toward necropsy expenses to those who submit tissue samples of dogs that died from PLE for the health study pertaining to PLE. Motion to approve the \$250 amount for a grant to those offering tissue samples for the health study on PLE made by Roberta Berman, 2nd by Christina Caridis. All in favor – motion carried.

Laura Reeves has invited several people in the breed to participate in a "round table discussion" podcast for a discussion regarding the breed and what makes them great as pets. This discussion will be donated by Laura for club use.

An option for members to complete a survey pertaining to various items was discussed as a means of receiving members' opinions. Christina Caridis stated Survey Monkey would be a good option and she will look in to this further and report back to the board.

A Facebook page for AMTC members only was discussed. At this time, one has been set up but until such time as the board drafts proposed language for our Guidelines under Club Communications, members will not be added. Once the language is drafted, the page can be utilized. The proposed addition of this as a means of communication within the membership will need approval at our next Annual meeting.

No further business – motion to adjourn made by Beverly Leidner, 2^{nd} by Christina Caridis. All in favor – Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:02 p.m. CDT.

Personal Statement for AMTC Application for Kat Patrick (Texangals)







thing that one was told about the breed's history was the story of the famous Black & Terrier 'Billy' who killed 100 rats in so many minutes. I believed this until I met Mike Homan, the Secretary of The London & Home Counties Terrier Club, who has Staffordshire Bull Terriers. Mike it was who told me, very kindly, that I was talking out of the back of my hat and that Billy was a white dog with coloured ears, much more of the Staffordshire type and that they always claimed him as one of 'theirs'. Over the years I have had to accept that Mike is right and it was 'Tiny', who was the renowned Black and Tan Terrier, belonging to Jemmy Shaw who killed rats against the clock in the rat pit. So here is a picture of Billy, by the look of it, just starting on his task.

THE CELEBRATED DOG "BILLY" KILLING 100 RATS AT THE WESTMINSTER PIT, 1827

"OLD SPORTING PRINTS" by Ralph Neville (1908) - published by the National Magazine Company

"Another old coloured engraving not undeserving of the feats of 'Billie' the rat-killing dog have also been commemorated by the engraver. A coloured plate represents the canine celebrity in question as the legend sets forth'killing 100 rats in five and a half minutes. Billie attracted some attention in his day as the following extract from the Morning Herald of October 22nd 1822 will demonstrate.

"The owner of the famous dog Billie, a rat-killing notoriety, has again undertaken that he shall perform the almost incredible task of killing 100 rats in 12 minutes. This task he performed before in eight-and-a-half for a bet of 20 sovereigns. The bet is 50, besides considerable other sums which are pending on the issue. The match will take place on Thursday evening next at Westminster Pit where the rats will be turned loose in a 12 foot square. The floor of the pit is to be whitened, so that the whole of the rats will be visible to the dog, and to the amateurs for whose accommodation galleries are already erected. Some differences have arisen on the last match, as it was said that one rat escaped, there are now an extra number provided to prevent any disappointment. An eminent artist is now employed taking the likeness of the dog and his master. They have each lost an eye through their valorous exploits, in endeavouring to clear this country of rate. We should also add that their esteem stands so high that a that a respectable picture frame maker has actually received and executed an order for 114 of the most costly frames that can be manufactured for so stylish an ornament, and that scarcely any of the fancy or sporting world that will not have it exhibited in their parlours. Billie is to be drawn with his silver collar on, and his master with a brilliant star, presented to him by the amateurs of rat-killing note."



Mike Homan has kindly sent us this photogrpah of a bronze in his collection. It is of Billie and you will see that he was much more of a Staffordshire Bull Terrier type than a Black and Tan Terrier.



This is the photo I posted to MT lists many years ago. Gloria Weiss gave this to me, along with many others in the mid-1980's. The info I have on the MT depicted:

"Little Lady Blue" bred by Dr. Viergutz (Canada), Sire: CH Little Joe Moe Bravier- ex -Dam: Lady Louise Bravier @ the Cleveland Ohio AMTC National in 1981, Judge Michelle Billings excused the bitch. @ the time, there was no color DQ. The DQ in the American Standard of Perfection for the Manchester Terrier was incorporated shortly after this incident, stating: "DQ Any color other than black and tan." Also have notation of the name "Carol Erskin" which may indicate the owner. Jo Ann

Attached please find the latest version of the Parent Club Registration Stats, including pdf. files for your breed, your group(s), and all AKC breeds. This latest version includes everything we shared in February updated to include 2019 mid-year data. Please note that this mid-year report only has 6 months of data for 2019 and Year-over-Year percentages will be skewed because of it.

Explanation for the term "Unique" in regards for each year = for that year this is the discreet number of dogs participating. For example, the same dog participated multiple times during a year but is only counted as one unique dog for that year.

Below is a reminder of changes that were made to these reports earlier this year in February. The following statistics were added:

- 1. Unique Dogs/Bitches in Companion Events
- 2. Unique Dogs/Bitches Placing in Performance Events

Note: While we are able to accurately count unique dogs participating (i.e., entering) in Conformation and Companion events, we do not have complete entry data for all Performance events for the time period. Therefore, you will notice that for Performance Events we provide counts of uniques *placing* in performance.

As with previous distributions of this data, please feel free to share the attached information with your club membership as you see fit in order to stimulate discussion about registration and possible changes or improvement initiatives per the original rationale for sharing (below).

Original rationale for this data sharing (from email dated 11/07/2017):

Although registration numbers have been on the rise now for a number of years after nearly two decades of continuous decline, some breeds are not rebounding as well as others. The Board and staff have discussed this matter, and we are reaching out to each Parent Club to determine how AKC registration processes and procedures can be improved to better support breeders and to explore how AKC could further assist Parent Clubs in their mission to develop and steward their breeds. Additionally, the Board has asked that certain registration information be shared with each Parent Club in order to provide a statistical snapshot of the current state of each breed and to stimulate discussion within and between clubs and staff regarding possible improvement initiatives.

As noted in the previous distributions of this information, the attached includes the counts of litters, litter complement, and dogs registered for your breed since 2008. [Note: "Complement" is the count of pups from each AKC litter.] The .pdf also includes the counts of unique dogs and bitches that are breeding and participating in conformation. Those counts are finite and will change only minimally over time and generally only due to cancellations of litters, dogs and/or awards.

On the other hand, there are a number of rows that indicate "to date," such as "Total Complement in Conformation (to date)." All rows with "to date" information are refreshed every time we reprocess this report. This is so you will have an accurate picture of the puppies produced in any given year. For instance, of the 1.7 million puppies produced in AKC Litters in 2008 (a.k.a., the Litter Complement for 2008), over 157,000 or 9.3% participated in conformation as of June 2018. Every time we update this chart, the system looks at all litters from 2008 to see if any additional dogs have started in conformation. Obviously, there will not be many 2008 pups entering Conformation or Breeding for the first time in 2018, but there will be many updates to the information known about pups born in 2017 and 2018.

Again, please feel free to share the attached information with your club membership as you see fit in order to stimulate discussion about registration, how AKC registration processes and procedures can be improved to better support breeders, and to explore how AKC could further assist Parent Clubs in their mission to develop and steward their breeds.







I wrote this after our pet therapy visit on Thursday night.

As I walked down the hallway of the busy emergency department of our local hospital with Solar in my arms, a patient locked eyes with me. Her bed was beside the nurses' station. On busy nights, it is common for there to be beds in the hallway. We had been there for an hour and a half and were about three-quarters of the way through our rounds. Solar was a new therapy dog and this was only her second visit making full rounds of the emergency department. Her earlier visits, which she had only started two months prior, had been restricted to the much smaller pediatric emergency wing because the hospital was waiting for flu season to die down.

The woman was lying upright in her bed with a hospital gown that covered a frail-looking frame. She had wispy red and silver hair pulled back in a messy bun and skin that had been spotted and wrinkled from a lifetime of sun exposure. As I approached, she looked at me with confusion on her face and I realized she might not be able to hear me speaking softly to her, or see the little bundle in my arms, so I came in close and repeated my question a little louder, "Would you like to pet a therapy dog?" In an instant of recognition, she set her eyes upon Solar, her face lit up and she snatched her out of my arms with a speed that caught me by surprise.

As this stranger drew Solar in close, squeezed her to her chest in a fierce hug and pressed her face up against Solar's cheek and held her there, giving her kisses, I saw Solar's eyes widen and bulge, her body tensed up, and I held my breath.

I held my breath because I had spent all 21 months of this precious puppy's life preparing her for this moment. I held my breath because 25 years and 5 generations of Toy Manchester Terriers had prepared us for this moment. I held my breath because the AKC breed standard describes the Manchester Terrier temperament as "discerning", and that word has carried far too much weight with some who have used it as an excuse for unstable temperaments and fearfully aggressive dogs.

This moment began with Solar's great-great-grandmother, who comforted my mother's patients while she provided in-home hospice care. This moment was conceived with the careful selection of Solar's parents for their outgoing and stable temperaments. The fate of this moment was sealed from her birth, with love, a stable environment and researched-based protocols of socialization, training, and the attention of a dedicated breeder.

So I held my breath and I smiled at Solar, and told her she was a such good girl. Solar's expression changed. Her eyes returned to their natural state. She looked at the woman, then relaxed into her arms. The woman began chattering at me rapidly in Spanish, excitement lighting up her face. She was asking me questions that I couldn't understand so I began to give her my answers to frequently asked questions.

"Her name is Solar."

"Solar," she repeated.

"She is 2 years old and she weighs 5 lbs."

She spoke again and I could tell it was a question from the inflection of her voice but the only word I could make out was niña.

"She's a girl."

She asked me another question.

"She's a Toy Manchester Terrier."

She repeated the question and a nurse came to the bedside. I knew the hospital often paired patients with nurses who could understand them so I looked at the nurse with raised eyebrows as the woman repeated her question for a third time. The nurse listened, said something to her, then shook her head. She turned to me.


"She has severe dementia. She's very confused."

I nodded and looked back at Solar who was still resting in the woman's firm grip. She actually looked content. The woman kept kissing her and stroking her fur and chattered away at her.

The nurse looked at me, "I just want you to know that she's been here for two days and this is the first time I have seen her smile. Her demeanor has completely changed. You've made her so happy. Her family just dropped her off and left her here. She's been very confused. No one has visited her." I could tell this bothered her.

She looked at her charge and smiled warmly, "How are you doing beautiful? She's precious! You really like her, don't you?! Do you need anything?" She fixed the blankets across the woman's lap.

American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL

I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING

I pledge:

- 1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC.
- 2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of study or bitches with no regard to quality.
- 3. To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program.
- 4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes.
- 5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING

I pledge:

- 1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale.
- 2. To provide all buyers with:
- A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller.
- B. Minimum three-generation pedigree.
- C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc.
- D. Provide instructions for feeding and care.
- E. Be available for guidance and questions.
- 3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes.
- 4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING

I pledge:

- 1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability.
- 2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition.
- 3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES

I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.

I understand that AKC makes no express or implied warranties or representations with respect to the AKC Stud Book. The information is provided "AS IS," with no warranties of any kind, express or implied. In addition, I understand that AKC makes no representation that the electronic transmission of the AKC Stud Book will be uninterrupted or error-free, and AKC will not be liable for the consequences of any interruptions or errors.

I understand and agree that AKC shall not be liable for indirect, special or consequential damages, or any loss of revenue, profits or data arising in connection with this Certification or the AKC Stud Book. I agree to indemnify the AKC, its officers, directors and employees for any loss, damage, claim or expense arising out of or related to my breach of the provisions of this Certification.

I understand that my breach of this Certification shall result in immediate and irreparable damage to AKC. I also understand that money damages may not be an adequate remedy for such breach. Accordingly, in such event, I agree that

AKC shall be entitled to injunctive relief to enforce or prevent any violation or threatened violation of this Certification. I agree that such remedy shall be in addition to and not exclusive of any other remedy available to AKC at law or in equity.

I understand and agree that any cause of action, controversy or claim arising out of or related to this Certification or as to the construction, interpretation and effect of this Certification shall be settled by arbitration pursuant to the applicable rules of the American Arbitration Association, except that equitable relief may be sought from any court of competent jurisdiction. The place of arbitration shall be New York, New York. The laws of the State of New York, without regard to provisions regarding conflicts of law, shall apply.

I understand and agree that once submitted, this Certification becomes the property of AKC. I further understand and agree that my receipt of the AKC Stud Book is not guaranteed, may be revoked at any time if given, and is subject to AKC's sole discretion.
