In the absence of club secretary, Kathy Nissen; President, Susan Thrasher, asked for a volunteer to serve as Secretary Pro-tem. Member, Mollie Kavrell volunteered. Motion to approve made by Susan Thrasher, 2nd by Carolyn Horowitz. All in favor. Motion carried.

Guests in attendance: Ellen Penz, Carol Pyrkosz, Tabitha, Tuetch, Ava Hata, Mathew D. Perry, Sarah Longshore, Secretary, Kathy Nissen, attended via telephone, however, was not counted in the attendance necessary for a quorum.

The required 10% of the membership in attendance were present to conduct official business.

Board member, Patrick Mackesey, read the 2021 Annual meeting minutes. Motion to approve said minutes made by Robin Gates, 2nd by Jo Ann Emrick. All in favor. Motion to approve, carried.

Reports:

Handouts of Secretary's, Treasurer's, District Governor and Committee reports were available to the membership upon entering the meeting. 1st V.P. Christina Caridis, read the committee reports to the members in attendance.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business:

Discuss and possible approval of 5 proposed revisions to our Standing Rules, Guidelines, Policies and Procedures:

1) Newsletter: The photo(s) of the National Specialty winner(s) shall be on the cover the issue immediately following the national event. Identifying information of the owner, breeder, handler, judge and presenter, if applicable, shall be listed within the first three (3) pages of the issue or inside front cover. Motion by Carolyn Horowitz, 2nd by Teena Uyeno. All in favor, motion carried.

2) Newsletter Guidelines: The Newsletter format shall be 8.5x11 inches (am 1979) and shall have normal size print.(am 1988). It shall not consist of more than 32 pages without Board approval. Content shall consist of Board, Governors and Committee reports, upcoming events, and breed related information, articles and other historical information. The issue following our National event shall allow for an additional number of pages in order to report on the event at the discretion of the board. Motion by Robin Gates, 2nd by Carolyn Horowitz. All in favor, motion carried.

3) National Specialty: Amend 1.0 National Specialties, Section 1.2 National Specialty Proposal by adding new criteria after the first sentence by adding: If a proposal is not submitted by June 30th, 18 months prior

4) Ethics Committee: Strike entire committee from Standing Rules, Guidelins, Policies and Procedures. Motion by Robin Gates, 2nd by Judi Fleischaker. All in favor, motion carried.

5) Breeder Mentor Committee: 1st V.P. Christina Caridis read the proposed newly drafted language to the membership in attendance. Motion by Carolyn Horowitz, 2nd by Mollie Kavrell. All in favor, motion carried.

Judges Selection Proposals: The board received proposals from four members. Unfortunately, a 5th one drafted by Carolyn Horowitz was inadvertently omitted in the handout provided the membership. Carolyn summarized the process to the members in attendance noting the current process needs scratched. Concerns brought up during the discussion regarding our current process noted it is difficult for judges to become approved to judge our breed, we tend to choose from low entry breed judges, the same judges are carried over year to year...Below is the proposal presented by Carolyn during the meeting.

PARENT CLUBS MAY REQUEST APPROVAL OF AN ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUAL TO JUDGE A BREED SPECIALTY SHOW Requirements for Applicant/Judge

- *Any eligible individuals including, but not limited to, professional handlers may be approved on a case-by-case, event-by-event request from the Parent Club for approval to judge a specialty in its breed.*
- *Must be 21 years of age.*
- *Must be occupationally eligible, except that professional handlers may be approved under this policy.*
- *Should be knowledgeable, with success in breeding/exhibiting/handling in the breed for 15 years or more.*
- *Procedure and anatomy test required and if applicable, scale or wicket test required.*
- *A \$35 per breed fee is required for nonapproved judges.*
- *Individuals may not be approved for more than one specialty per calendar year and no more than five specialties cumulatively.*

My suggestion is as follows:

1. Appoint a Judges Selection committee composed of geographically diverse, experienced exhibitors who qualify as Judge's mentors under the current rules along with possessing a good understanding of ring procedure/the AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows
2. The Committee should consist of no more than one current board member (this should apply to most 'important' committees, frankly, to avoid the appearance of self-dealing by the Board and Officers), and should operate independently from Judges Education.
3. Solicit nominations and feedback via the club website from the membership
4. Encourage long-time members (15+ Years in the club in addition to the AKC requirements) willing to judge a specialty to submit proof they meet the AKC's criteria for consideration on a slate
5. The committee should present a slate of 5 judges each year to present for balloting taking into consideration the following:
 1. Judges' overall fitness to judge a large entry with large classes, special attractions, etc.
 2. Exhibitor/Member feedback from prior judging assignments at specialties
 3. Use of MTs in groups and NOHS groups in the preceding 5 years
 4. Geographic diversity
 5. Experience with MTs in general (breeding, owning, exhibiting) along with overall judging experience.
6. Ballots should include a special annotation ("Breeder Judge") for any AKC Approved breeder-judges (Permit or Regular Status) or Breeder-Judges included on the ballot via the alternative AKC process
7. Retain the rule stating a judge may only judge a National once within 5 years.

Further, the rules should be amended to state that judges selected by the Regional specialties held in conjunction with National Specialties either from an all-breed panel or independently by the regional show committee should be subject to Judges Selection committee approval.

*Teena Uyeno motioned for Carolyn Horowitz to form a Judges Selection Committee, to develop and administer a new system. 2nd by Dianna Texter. All in favor, motion carried.

National Trophy Sponsorship: Treasurer, Dianna Texter, noted it is sometimes difficult for those sponsoring specific trophies to ensure they receive the requested trophy and would like suggestions as to how to rectify this. Generally, a list of offered trophies is provided which may end up with a 'first come first served' taking place. Suggestions made by various members: Raffle the placements, if you sponsor a class you pay for all placements, specify date trophy sponsorship opens – 1st to pay sponsors said trophy. Christina Caridis will work on language for this proposed revision to our SRs and create a list for trophy sponsorship.

Approval of Judges Education Breed Mentor: Judges Education Chairperson, Jo Ann Emrick, presented information regarding Judy Deets' qualifications to become an approved breed mentor. Jo Ann will present the information to the board requesting approval of Judy Deets as a breed mentor.

AKC Website's Breed Video: Laura Rice requested a judges' education seminar be recorded for website. Carolyn Horowitz noted the webinar is up but needs updated. Michelle Barlak mentioned the AKC could be contacted to request a new recording due to our breed standard revision. Motion to contact AKC by Carolyn Horowitz, 2nd by Jo Ann Emrick. All in favor, motion carried.

Chuck A Duck Fundraiser: Junior Showmanship committee chairperson, Judi Fleischaker, stated the event raised \$395.00. She also noted there were more juniors at this year's national than previous ones with 9 entered.

Meet the Breed Discussion: A discussion occurred regarding the AKC Traveling Meet the Breed Booth. The AKC is offering stipends of \$500-\$800 depending on the number of dogs available for the public to meet. Lunch, parking, fuel can be covered by the AKC and includes a free lunch. Anyone can man the booth and the AKC is willing to pay anyone – even non manchester people. You don't need to be an expert or mentor. Teena Uyeno urged us to man these booths when the AKC brings these booths to towns close to members. She has stickers, book markers, etc. to send anyone. If anyone needs help, reach out to Michelle Barlak, Teena Uyeno or Robin Gates.

Manchester Numbers: Carolyn Horowitz mentioned nice manchesters are not being seen everywhere and the numbers are dropping. We need to increase numbers by breeding our bitches, allowing fellow breeders to whelp litters and offer leasing of bitches, get our dogs out in public looking like pets with cute outfits and hats. The 'Meet the Breed' is an excellent opportunity to showcase the breed.

No further business, motion to adjourn by Carolyn Horowitz, 2nd by Robin Gates. All in favor, motion carried. The 2022 Annual meeting adjourned at 8:47 p.m. CDT.

DELEGATE'S REPORT

Okay, so it's June and once again the AKC had a meeting here in beautiful Newark, NJ. This time I cannot report on any committees, since I could not attend the meetings on Monday, and the committee minutes have not been published - as yet.

However, I can report on the Delegate's Assembly. Not much happened.

After the opening speeches and introductions of the new delegates we voted on one proposal which codifies allowing puppies to transfer from one division of the puppy class to the next class. So, if you miscalculate your pup's age when you enter, say the 812 month class to the 12 to 18 month class, since your math needs assistance. Or, in the case of your veterans, you can switch from one age class to the next. It's called housekeeping. It was approved.

Other than that, a whole bunch of proposals were read which will be voted upon in September. There were 14 of these proposals, most of which were housekeeping proposals dealing with veterinarians being available at shows, gun dogs (I am totally clueless as to what this is all about) and such like.

However, there are two proposals that differ. First, term limitations for Board members was done away with. This was something they tried to and didn't work. Oh well...back to the old ways, but hopefully not to the good ol' boys system. Hopefully the delegates are smarter now.

The second proposal, which has come up before, is of much greater interest, especially since ours is a low entry breed with hard-to-find majors. This proposal suggests that class dogs who place in their respective group can receive championship points from the group. As of now, if a class dog goes Group 1, the dog can pick up the major points granted to any breed from that group being shown that day. To put it simply (?) points will be granted for Group 2, 3 and 4 as well as Group 1.

So the question is: what do you think of this idea? Do you like it? Do you hate it? Do you have no opinion? Do you really care? Why?

As a point of interest, as far as I know, only one Manchester Terrier ever finished from the Group, it was one of Susan Medlock's dogs, but I don't remember which one.

So much for this meeting. Please let me know what you think about the group point proposal. I will vote according to your wishes.

TO: The American Manchester Terrier Club

My name is Ian Petzold. I am 13 years old. I live on a small working farm in Wyoming. Including my Toy Manchester, we have four dogs that are House pets. The other dogs are a Scottish Terrier, an Italian Greyhound, and a Boston Terrier. We also have an Anatolian Shepherd Livestock Guardian Dog (LGD) that is on constant patrol. As well as breeding animals of pigs, goats, sheep, horses, chickens, and the milk cow. There is a very wild barn cat who takes care of most pests. The Scotty dog and the LGD take care of the skunks, coons, and occasional badger. Our Anatolian has also deals with bear and Mt Lions. My Toy Manchester, Scarlet, loves our Anatolian and tries to keep up with her. The exercise keeps Scarlet is great shape. I have two older brothers and an older sister. One of my brothers and my sister are in college and not home much anymore. I am Homeschooled. All of my siblings are/were homeschooled. My oldest brother is at the School of Mines in South Dakota. He is almost done becoming a Mechanical Engineer and works for RPM Technologies. My Sister is going to the University of Wyoming to be a Computer Engineer. I want to become a Prosthetic Surgeon. Our state has a program that if you go to College and Med School then come back to Wyoming and be a doctor here for three years then the state will pay 100% of your Medical School Tuition Fees. It is called the WAMMY Program. I learned about the WAMMY Program from one of my Rock-Climbing Instructors and also my pediatrician used the program to become a doctor too. Since I am Home schooled, we do science around Human Anatomy and do Chemistry more toward medicines. I also do sports with the Public School District. In Cross Country I was top 5 in our district for 6th Graders. I also do Wrestling, Diving, Track with the 1600m, 400m and Pole Vaulting. I like to Rock Climb in the Summers. I like to take computers apart and solder parts together to make new stuff. I also do 4-H with My Dairy Goats, Market Sheep, Dog and Poultry. My mom helps us buy market lambs as well as raising market lambs from our own sheep to show and sell at our 4-H Livestock sale. I saved money for 3 years to be able to get a good puppy. When we turn 12 my mom lets us get a puppy of our own. We must agree that we take the dog to two years' worth of our 4-H dog program

meetings (Our program here is really really good!) We also must have our own money set aside for the first year of vetting to include shots, spay/neuter as well as buy the appropriate kennel and dog collars and leashes. I told my mom that I wanted a Toy Manchester Terrier so started looking in 2019 for a breeder. She sent lots of emails and did calls. One of the emails was to an AKC Breeder from the AKC page. It was to Heaven Hi Manchesters. Jerri emailed back and told us about Dianna Texter. Jerri Gave us her phone number and my mom called her. That was in February 2020. I remember because it was pre Covid and exactly a year later My mom flew to California with me in February 2021 to pick out my dog. Flying home with Scarlet from a 75 degree day in California to a -19 degree day in Wyoming was very memorable. I spent the month of February shoveling snow so I could take my puppy out the back shop door and walk her down the snow shovel paths to go to the bathroom! When I was 7 I started helping my mom Artificially Inseminate (AI) Dairy Goats. That doe kidded and the doe kid I bottle raised and when she turned 18 months I helped AI her. She had a doe and buck kids. I did not get to AI that doe though because we had a bad case of buck escapades. So, she was bred by live cover. It happens. She did not kid properly though. A few weeks ago Her kid died inside. It is called intrauterine death. My mom has been raising goats for almost 40 years. She saw the problem pretty quick. I helped her remove the kid and doctor the doe. That was about a month ago. My doe is fully recovered and milking well now. I milk my own goats and sell milk. I also have Dairy Sheep and feed my own bottle lambs and kids. Dianna said one of the things that I needed to include in this letter is why I want to be a member of the American Manchester Terrier Club. One thing my mom has taught us here on the farm is that our decisions as animal breeders should always be to improve what we have. If what we are doing is not improving the livestock, then we either need to change what we are doing or stop doing it. So, like my goat for instance. She did not kid well, and her udder is not what it should be. So, I am choosing to not breed her again. I will go back up to two generations before and pair that doe with a different buck and start over with my AI program with the Dairy Goats. It is better to recognize that I need to stop and look at what and where things seemed to go wrong and go back to that point, then begin again. With the goats I have my mom's 40 years of working with our breed. With my dog I have Dianna to help me. It is always better to have more help and mentors in anything you do. For my sports I have Coaches and Rock Climbing I have a Belayer to spot me when I fall. Being in the Manchester Terrier Club is like that. Sort of like a network of people to learn from.

As for what I would like to do with my dog. I want to show her to get her Champion title. Then I would very much like her to have puppies that my family can spoil. I would like to get her AKC Companion dog title and do some Agility with her. After she has a successful litter of puppies I would very much like to AI her if Dianna thinks my dog would be a good enough breeding dog to use some of the semen Dianna has. I really do love the Manchester Terrier Breed. My dog is smart, loyal, full of endless energy, blanket stealing, kangaroo bouncing dog. So long as she produces dogs just like her then we would be promoting the great things about the Manchester Terrier Breed.

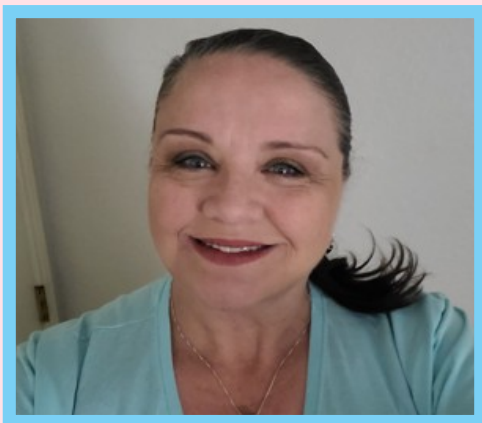



American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING I pledge: 1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC. 2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of studs or bitches with no regard to quality. 3. To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program. 4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes. 5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING I pledge: 1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale. 2. To provide all buyers with: A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller. B. Minimum three-generation pedigree. C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc. D. Provide instructions for feeding and care. E. Be available for guidance and questions. 3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes. 4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING I pledge: 1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability. 2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition. 3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.
