SUMMARY OF AMTC BOARD ACTIONS **April 2023 through June 2023**

(Full Board meeting minutes can be found on our Club's website in the Members' section)

April -2023

COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS:

Rescue chairperson, Michelle Barlak, noted most of the recent rescues had been placed. Two puppies are still being fostered in Texas. Another rescue may be coming in from Mississippi shortly.

HOF Revision chairperson, Roberta Berman, stated revisions still a work in progress. Regarding member input, only 4 suggestions from members were submitted.

OLD BUSINESS:

AKC 3 Point Major for Reserve Winners at Specialty Events – Roberta Berman, AKC Delegate, stated a majority of the feedback she has received has been positive.

2024 National Sweepstakes Judge Nominees - Secretary, Kathy Nissen, reported there will be 5 candidates to choose from for judging our 2024 Sweepstakes classes on the 2024 conformation/sweepstake judges ballot. Waiting to receive one more sweepstakes nominee's biography – when received, the ballot will be prepped and mailed to the membership.

NEW BUSINESS:

Possible Purchase of Club Banners – Christina Caridis requested the club purchase additional club banners for use at various events. Following discussion a motion to purchase 5 additional banners was made by Dianna Texter, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor, motion carried.

Membership Lapel Pins – Secretary, Kathy Nissen, stated we are running low on club membership lapel pins and provided 3 bids for board review for purchasing 100 or 200 pins. Motion made by Dianna to purchase 200 pins, 2nd by Christina Caridis. All in favor, motion carried. Also suggested by Dianna and Christina would be to have these pins available for member purchase at a cost of \$5.00/pin during our national specialties.

Hall of Fame Photos - Permission requested by Christina Caridis to have the HOF photos uploaded to the "Manchester and English Toy Terrier – The Breed Archive" website. Motion to approve by Dianna Texter, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor, motion carried.

"Capturing Legacy Breeders Interviews" – the AKC has contacted breed clubs noting so many long time knowledgeable breeders have passed away and with their passing, so has their legacy. The AKC would like to have parent clubs video interview their 'legacy breeders' so future generations can appreciate and learn from these breeders' knowledge of their breed(s) and accomplishments. The Board agreed this would be a very worthwhile project. President, Jeremy McClister, stated Rachel McClister has offered and would be willing to do interviews with our legacy breeders. More updates forthcoming.

May 2023

COMMITTEE CHAIR REPORTS:

Michelle Barlak –

AKC Purebred Preservation Bank – there will be an update from the AKC during the June AKC Delegates meeting.

Health – AKC DNA Project – the AKC announced an initiative to collect DNA samples from each breed to aid in examining the health and genetic diversity of breeding populations, and to expedite health research in hopes of developing tests for breed specific diseases. Michelle is looking into the program and it will be discussed at the June AMTC board meeting.

Rescue - All rescues surrendered by a breeder with health issues have been placed. Another is coming into rescue to be fostered in Kansas and Rescue is assisting with placing a standard needing rehomed currently located in Illinois.

OLD BUSINESS:

HOF Revision – Continues to be a work in progress. A main concern is to ensure any revisions are thoroughly reviewed. With the AKC adding many new titles for various areas of participation with our dogs, the committee is researching how to include them based on level of difficulty for qualifying points. Secretary, Kathy Nissen, offered to contact various terrier parent clubs that offer HOF awards to ask how they determine awards for their HOF.

AMTC Pins – Previously, the board has agreed we need to update our membership pin with our new logo and determine how many to order. Secretary, Kathy Nissen, has contacted several lapel pin companies for bids. With the new pins becoming available, the board also suggested they be offered for sale to the membership at a cost of \$5.00 per pin; however, they will still be included in our new member packets at no charge. The board agreed to order 400 pins. Kathy will contact the company and get the pins ordered.

NEW BUSINESS:

Judges Selection Process Revision – The committee to draft the revision of our Judges Selection Process will meet May 25th, 2023 to go over the outline of the proposal submitted by Carolyn Horowitz at the 2021 AGM. The committee is hopeful to have the full proposed draft to present to the board at the June meeting for discussion and possible approval and possible ratification at the 2023 AGM.

2022 Standing Rules Revisions – 1st V.P. Christina Caridis provided the board the 2022 Standing Rules revisions approved by the board for review and proofing. Once completed, Christina will finalize the Standing Rules for uploading to the website for publishing.

Agility Chairperson – The Board regretfully accepted Karen Langlois' resignation as Agility Chair. Lisa Nonog has agreed to take the position.

August 2023

Possible Subscription Purchase for Zoom Pro – President, Jeremy McClister, requested the club purchase a subscription for Zoom Pro for an annual fee of \$180.00 for club - motion was made by Michelle Barlak 2nd by Ellen Murgagh to purchase the subscription. All in favor, motion carried. Board meetings will now take place via Zoom Pro.

June 2023

Reports of Officers/Board Members

Dianna Texter suggested the board consider placing funds into CDs earning a current interest rate of 4.53%. Following discussion, a motion to set up 3 CDs each with \$2000.00 with automatic renewal at maturity was made by Roberta Berman, 2nd by Christina Caridis. All in favor, motion carried. Another suggestion made by Dianna was to add two board members to the checking account in case of an unforeseen situation arising where Dianna and/or Christina were unavailable. The board agreed to add President, Jeremy McClister and Secretary, Kathy Nissen to this account.

OLD BUSINESS:

2022 Standing Rules Revisions- 1st V.P. Christina Caridis previously submitted to the Board, via email, the 2022 updated Standing Rules booklet as approved at the 2022 Annual Meeting. Secretary, Kathy Nissen will submit this updated booklet to webmaster, Jo Biasi for uploading to the club's website.

Judges Selection Committee Process Update – 1st V.P. Christina Caridis, submitted a combined proposal from the Judges Selection Committee containing rules for the committee and process for selection of judges. Motion to approve the proposal as submitted for presentation at the 2023 annual meeting and uploading to the website made by Kathy Nissen, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor, motion carried.

New AMTC Pin Update – Secretary, Kathy Nissen, noted the pins had been received. Newly approved members will receive this new pin with their membership packet.

NEW BUSINESS:

Approval of New Member Applicants – The board unanimously approved the applicants as published in the May 2023 newsletter. Ava Hata, Brianna Hutchins (Junior), Rick and Mona Lilly, Thomas, Lara, and Ashley (Junior) Swirbel and Tabitha Teutsch/William Bell. Secretary, Kathy Nissen will inform them of their approval for membership and send out their membership packets.

2024 AMTC National Proposal Submitted by Dist. 2 Gov., Wendy Schober – the Board reviewed the proposal for the 2024 AMTC National event . Motion to approve this proposal made by Kathy Nissen, 2nd by Christa Caridis. All in favor, motion carried

2023 District 2 Specialty Proposal – Dist. 2 Governor, Wendy Schober, also sent a proposal for holding this district's annual specialty to be held during the AKC National Championship events. Motion to approve made by Christina Caridis, 2nd by Michelle Barlak. All in favor, motion carried.

2025 AMTC National Proposal Submitted by Dist. 5 Governor, Christina Caridis – The Board reviewed a proposal submitted by Dist. 5 Governor, Christina Caridis, for the 2025 AMTC National Specialty to be held in Enumclaw, WA on August 16th and 17th with it being a two day Independent Specialty. Christina Caridis and Lisa Nonog will co-chair. Motion to approve this proposal made by Michelle Barlak, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor. Motion carried. More info will be forthcoming.

Code of Ethics & Breeder Referral – Secretary, Kathy Nissen noted perhaps the Code of Ethics be brought more up to date. No action taken. Christina Caridis suggested removing the language referencing 'breeder referral' in our Standing Rules contained in Section 2 – Duties - Article 2.9 – Duties of District Governors – last bulleted section: 'serve as breeder referral contact for the District or designate a representative subject to Board approval' from this section. Motion by Christina Caridis, 2nd by Ellen Murtagh. All in favor, motion carried. **Christina requested to amend her motion to add in Section 2 Article 2.6 – Duties of Secretary – add bullet 'serve as breeder referral contact person for those interested in locating a Manchester terrier.' Motion to amend Christina's original motion made by Michelle Barlak, 2nd by Dianna Texter. All in favor, motion carried.

Manchester Terrier Versatility Program – A proposal was submitted by Rachel Jonas and Breanna Uyeno to provide recognition for those dogs having earned titles in various areas. It would be a "Manchester Versatility Program." The MVP (Manchester Versatility Program) award would acknowledge and celebrate those dogs' accomplishments while also celebrating the versatility of the breed and the beneficial attention the breed receives from such achievements. 





American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL

I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING

I pledge:

1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC.

2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed

as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of studs or bitches with no regard to quality. 3. To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either

active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program.

4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes.

5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING

I pledge:

1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale.

2. To provide all buyers with:

A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller.

B. Minimum three-generation pedigree.

C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc.

D. Provide instructions for feeding and care.

E. Be available for guidance and questions.

3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes.

4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING

I pledge:

1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability.

2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition.

3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES

I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.
